Top 10 Rights

- Freedom of conscience, speech, assembly, and peaceful dissent (II.1).

Top 10 Duties on Power

- No secret law: rules without public record are void (I.4).
- Burden of proof is on power: restrictions require plain speech + evidence hooks (I.3).
- Every major decision/enforcement action must have a contest lane, timelines, and remedy (I.5).
- Major programs must publish scope, rationale, authority, costs, and contest pathways (III.1).
- Conflicts must be disclosed; recusal is mandatory; undisclosed conflicts void decisions until cured (III.2).
- Non-auditable power is illegitimate (III.3).
- Transparency is default; secrecy is narrow, mapped, time-bounded, and reviewed within 90 days (IV).
- Secrecy can never conceal wrongdoing or rights abuse (IV.4).
- Missed response timelines auto-escalate to audit and generate public non-compliance flags (VI.5).
- Protected actions require Two-Key integrity; no silent edits; Key B must be in-channel or logged as attributed attestation (COP-G).

How to Contest

- If power acts against you: demand the evidence hook and the BER record-set IDs (II.2, XIII.2).
- File a contest in PRAS using the plain-speech lane (equal standing to expert lane) (VI.4).
- PRAS outputs are non-binding reports, but they force records into public view (VI.2-VI.3).
- If the actor misses timelines: auto-escalation + public non-compliance flag (VI.5).
- Retaliation for dissent/whistleblowing/contest use is a major violation (VIII.3).

What Records Must Exist

- For any coercive program: published authority, scope, costs, evidence hooks, and contest pathways (III.1).
- For secrecy: a Secrecy Order with justification, redaction map, impacted BER IDs, and a sunset (IV.3).
- For digital rights (II.6/II.7): MDDS record sets—MDDS-CATALOG, DENIAL-DOCKET, THROTTLE-REGISTER, SURVEILLANCE-MAP, PORTABILITY-STANDARD, COMPLIANCE-AUDITS, PROCUREMENT-INFLUENCE (BER X.9.4).
- For amendments/protected actions: change log ID + Key A + Key B seal (COP-G).

What Happens When Records Are Missing

- Rules without record are void (I.4).
- Missing BER records is itself a violation and triggers escalation (VIII.2A).
- For II.6/II.7: automatic PRAS flag + continuity remedy within 24h unless due-process order exists (BER X.9.6).
- Escalation ladder: corrective order (7d), audit + non-compliance designation (14d), restitution + removal pathways (30d), structural remedy (60d) (BER X.9.6).
